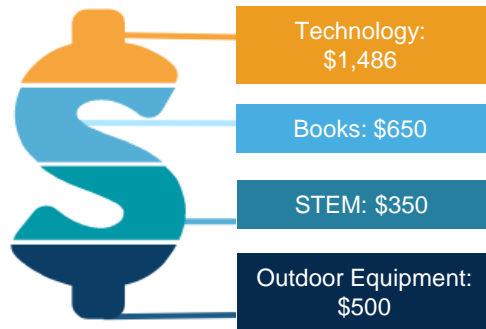


2020-2021 Education Mini-Grants – Richland-Bean Blossom School District

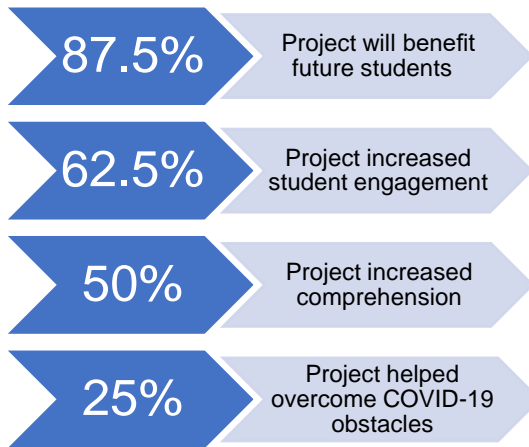

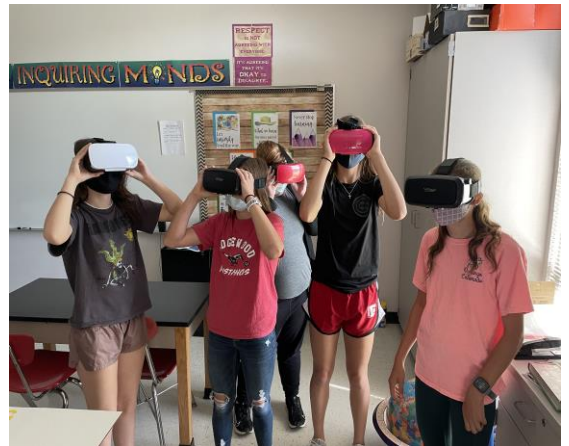
